We came up with an idea that making a new educational organization that enables you to get **profession-oriented lessons** since you are **high school students**.

We name the institution **NAO**
(**Non-compulsory Autonomous educational Organization**)

What is NAO?

- High school students can take NAO's entrance exam **anytime**.

They are asked to take only a few courses which are required in the field where **they want to learn**.

- Students who have got enough knowledge to do research at college can take a transfer admission test regardless of their ages.
(If they pass the test, they can start their research from now on)
