Background: Two main issues

1. Shortage of teachers

The results showed a shortage of 2558 teachers in April 2022.


The OECD surveyed elementary and junior high schools in

48 countries




JHS teachers in Japan worked on average 56 hours each week!

Which needs to be solved first?



We can't solve the problem of working conditions without first getting more teachers!

Research question

What "we" can do as private high school students



How can we increase the number of students who are interested in teaching?

Methods

Method	Details	Tools
Literature review	Reading books and newspaper articles to find out about the issues and previous campaigns to get people interested in teaching and their results.	Books Articles
Pre-interview Questionnaire	We carried out a questionnaire on 6 teachers at our school. There were nine questions. The goal of this questionnaire was to know about their working conditions and why they wanted to be a teacher. Dates: October 25 to October 29.	Paper
Follow- up Interviews	We asked four teachers follow-up questions based on their answers to our questionnaire. Dates: October 26th, 29th, 31st	Oral

Date: From March 26th, 2021

Method: Twitter

Who: The Ministry of Education (Japan)

Goal: They wanted teachers to share the good points of teaching using SNS.


Case Study: "Kyoshi no Baton" (Teacher's Baton)

Was it successful? No

- Teachers shared negative points of teaching.
- This was widely reported in the media and it highlighted the bad points of teaching.

According to Uchida not enough consideration was given to:


- The popularity of SNS (including Twitter)
- 2) Use of Twitter by **younger teachers** who are suffering from long working hours
- 3) School teachers can't say the bad points of the job at school

Discussion

Social media is not a good way to share information about being a teacher



It is not direct or active

Findings: Teacher Questionnaires / Interviews

Question: Why did you want to be a teacher?

- Many teachers were inspired by their teachers.
- Most of the teachers have wanted to teach since they were students at school or university.
- Most wanted to work with young people.
- Most wanted to share and explain information

Findings: Teacher Questionnaires / Interviews

Question: What do you feel are the good points of being a teacher?

 Almost all teachers said they feel happy when seeing the students grow up and make progress.

They all enjoy talking with students and sharing knowledge.

Findings: Teacher Questionnaires / Interviews

Question: How do they think we can convey the good points of teaching to young people?

"Teachers don't have to convey the good points of teaching to young people. Students should find them!"

"Teachers should be good role models for their students, so a positive image of teaching is spread."

"Share with second year high school students in their Career Design class."

Discussion

High school students should be targeted!

They should experience teaching a class to feel the good points


Experiencing teaching will make high school students:

Suggestion:


Let's give students the opportunity to experience the good points of teaching by being teachers:
