The protagonist is the main male character and the narrator. The heroine is a female character who supports the protagonist.

1. Distribution of "Hero" characteristics between protagonist and heroine



One or the other is a "Hero as a catalyst" or a "sacrifice." "The film takes an unorthodox but effective approach to the "Hero's Journey" by distributing the characteristics of the "hero" among the main characters, including the villain."
