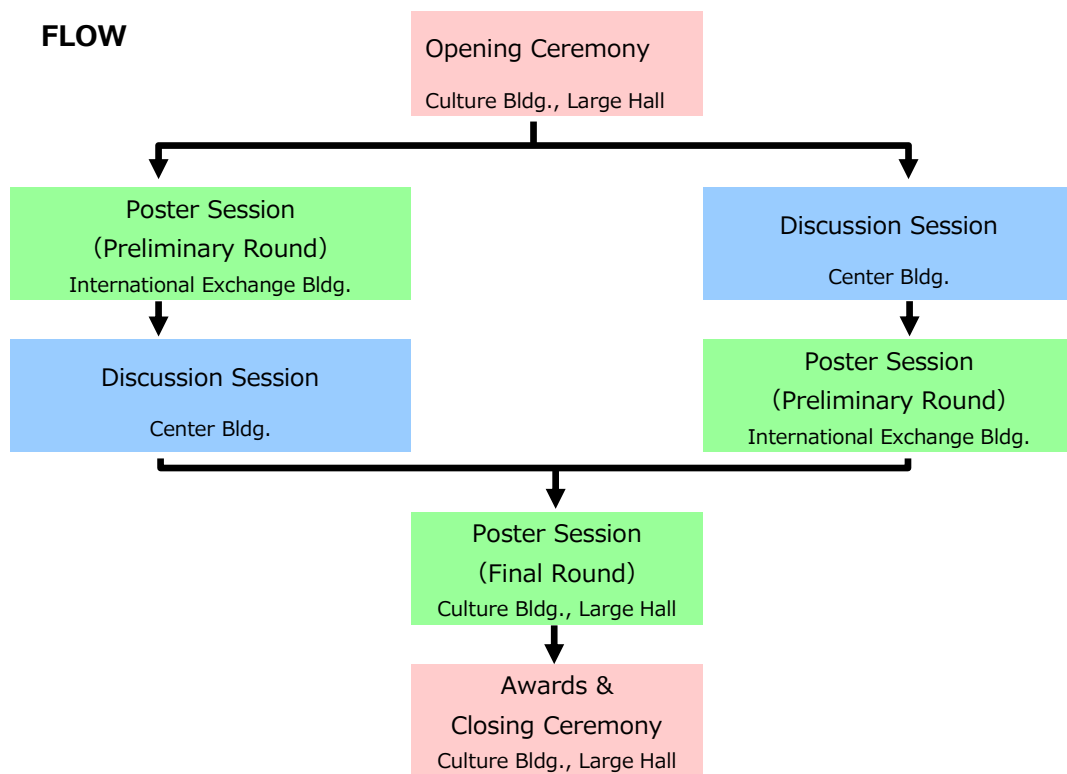
Program Outline

- Opening ceremony declares the Forum open.
- Following the opening, participants are divided into two halves for Poster preliminary round and Discussion sessions.
- At the end of the first half of the morning session, the two sessions will switch places. Attendees move between the sites and resume the second half of the morning session.
- Poster final round is held in the afternoon following lunch.
- The forum concludes with Awards Ceremony and Closing Ceremony.

Poster Session

- Goals**

It aims to provide an opportunity to present daily research findings, exchange views and opinions, gain insight into global social issues through exposure to presentations from other schools, and inspire each other.
- Presentation**

Each school displays one pre-printed poster summarizing the accomplishments of daily research. School representatives will make an oral presentation in English to judges in front of the poster.
- Session Facilitation**

This year's poster session consists of two phases;
Morning - Preliminary round by all schools, and Afternoon - Final round by excellent presentation schools.

Preliminary Round

 - One presentation per school/unit, Time limit 4 minutes.
 - After several presentations, there will be an open Q&A session with the presenter, judges, and students from other schools. This portion will not be scored.

Final Round

 - Stage presentations by finalist schools at Large Hall.
 - One presentation per school/unit, Time limit 4 minutes, No Q&A.
 - Schools not shortlisted will participate as audiences for the final presentations.
- Awards**
 - Minister of Education Award (One school for the best presentation)
 - Chief Judge's Award (One school for outstanding presentation)
 - Encouragement Award (Five ^{*tentative} finalist schools)
- Judging Elements**
 - Appropriateness of Research Theme
 - Adequacy of Research Methods
 - Proposals for Problem Solving and Future Prospects
 - English Presentation Skills
