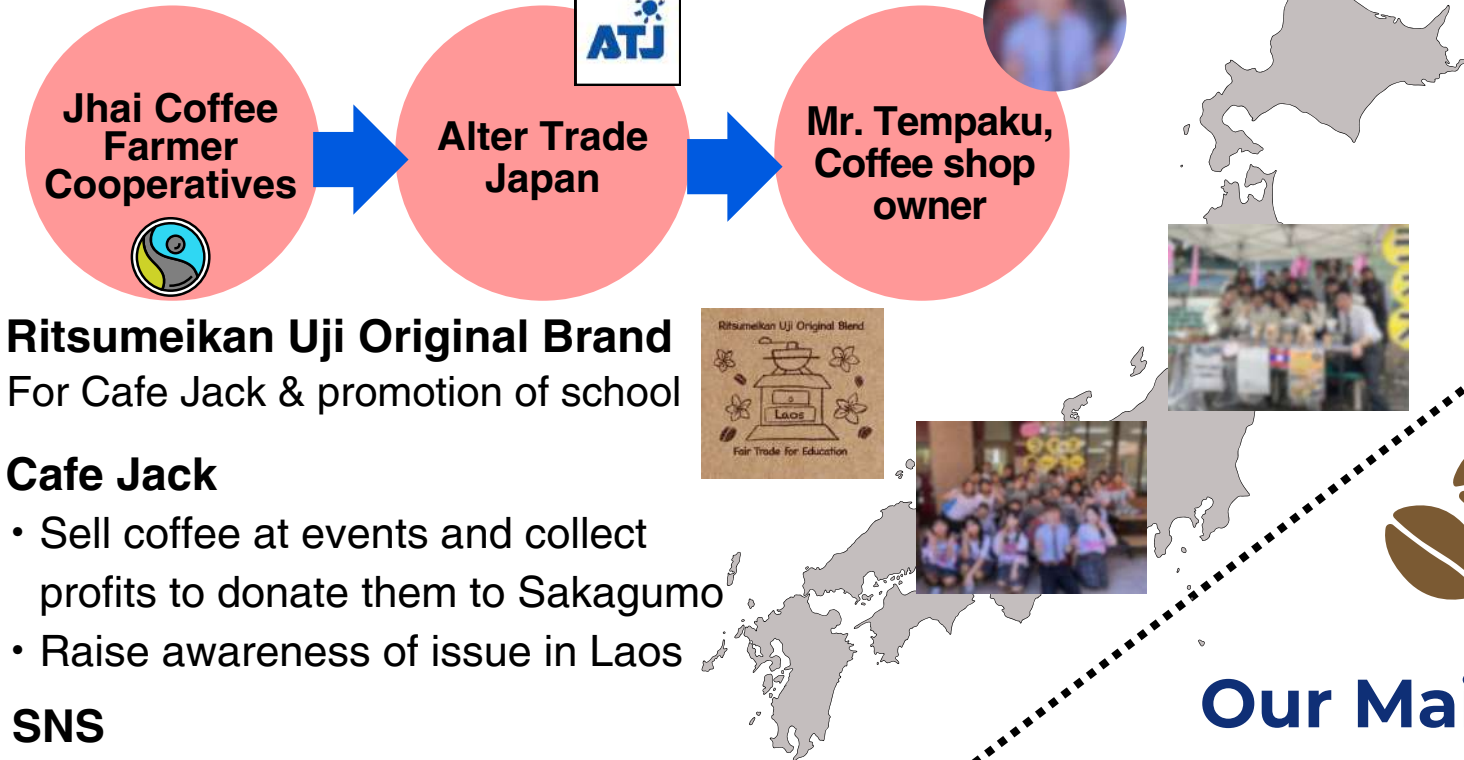

Laos Coffee Sales

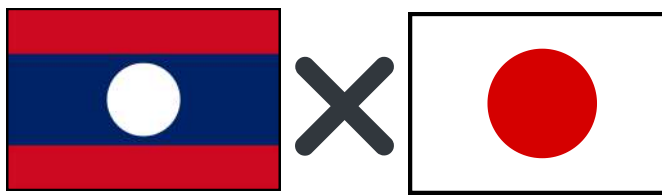


1, What is Laonin?

- A volunteer organization started in 2016 to solve educational issues in Laos
- Consists of 26 students from both junior high and high school
- Purchase fair-trade coffee beans from Laos and sell them in Japan
- Profit goes to "Sakagumo Dormitory" in Pakse, southern Laos, to support excellent high school students in rural areas who cannot go to school for some reasons even though they want to go to school

What is "Sakagumo"?

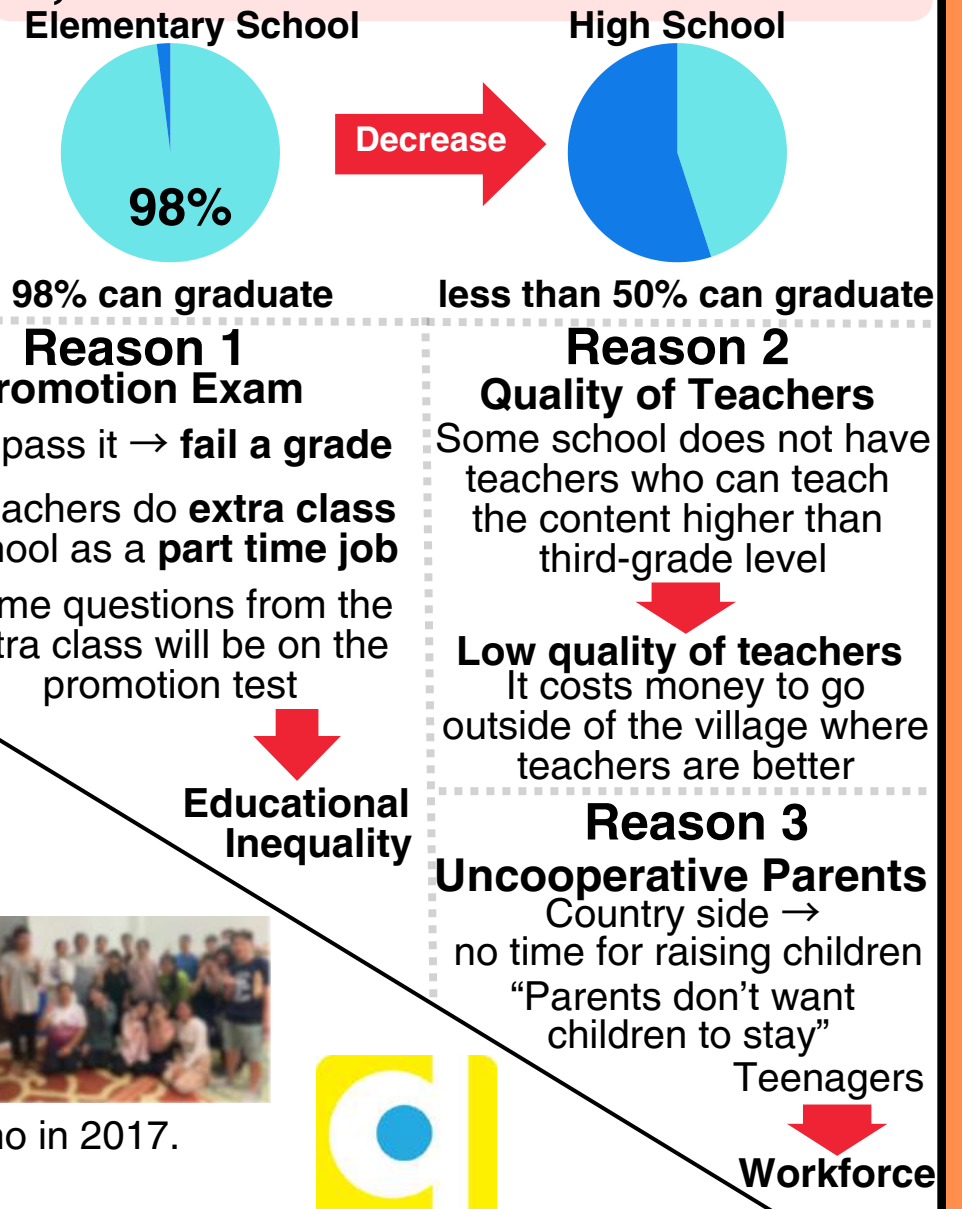
- student dormitory located in Pakse, southern Laos.
- Students in Laos face difficulty going to school because of:
 - Lack of schools in town/village
 - Not well maintained roads

Sakagumo dormitory enables students to get the environment where they can go to school by letting them live in there

Non-Government Organization "Quatro" has established Sakagumo in 2017.

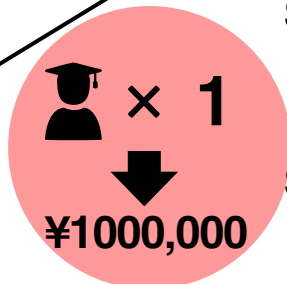
4, Sakagumo and Laonin's Relationship
