Isn't Japanese people's **awareness of refugee support** low?

- Data from the "Opinion Survey on Foreign Policy"
- Interview survey during the Tokyo study tour

Purpose

More refugee issues ↔ Low awareness of refugees support
 Few surveys have been conducted these surveys and research
 → improve Japan's international standing

Hypothesis

There is a lack of **education** and **reporting** about refugees in Japan
 → There are few opportunities to learn about refugees.

People cannot **feel the problems about refugees familiar** so they only have **low awareness**

Research Method

- Survey on awareness of refugees and support**
 Investigate awareness and understanding about current situation of refugees
 Subject : Hyogo SHS students
 Content : based on previous researches

**Is there really a lack of awareness about refugees?
 How much education did they have about refugees?**

② Hold a workshop on refugees

- Divide subjects into three groups
- Workshop + Constant information provision
 - Only Workshop
 - No approach


③ Conduct follow-up surveys

- Immediately after the workshop
- Two weeks after the workshop
- Two months after the workshop

Does education lead higher awareness of support?






Research Result

2. What role do you think that Japan should play in international society? (Multiple answers possible)




<Post-investigation>

Consideration

- Participants showed increased agreement with the importance of humanitarian aid and refugee support
- This reflects a growing recognition of Japan's role in the international community
- The workshops provided information on the current situation of refugees**
- Learning about these issues appears to have contributed to increased awareness and understanding
